Official Information Act request

Thank you for your information request dated 14 Hui-tanguru 2019. You asked for the following information:

- *all information that pertains to the formation of the boundary map for Hauraki in Te Kahui Mangai*
- *emails (including any email correspondence pertaining to this subject that was transacted using non-official email addresses)*
- *any and all written correspondence, telephone records, official documents, advisories of any kind, that was germane to the formation of the Hauraki boundaries in the map*
- *the names and designations of people involved in the formation of that map and decision making around that map*
- *minutes of meetings held with regard to that map, notes/minutes of meetings held with people from Hauraki with regard to the formation of that map*
- *notes/minutes of meetings held with people from any of the three Tauranga Moana iwi with regard to the formation of that map.*

On 8 Poutū-te-rangi 2019 you were notified of an extension of time for the response to search and identify the relevant information subject to the request.

On 22 Poutū-te-rangi 2019, Fiona McBeath, Deputy Chief Executive, Organisational Support, from Te Puni Kōkiri contacted you to advise that we would respond to your request by 28 Poutū-te-rangi 2019.

Your request has been considered in accordance with the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

A search of our electronic records, hard copy files and emails identified thirty six documents within the scope of your request. The documents and my decisions with regard to the release of the information are set out in the table attached as Appendix A.

Iwi Rohe maps installed 2005-06

When Te Kāhui Māngai (TKM) was first established in 2005-06 iwi rohe maps were inserted as follows:

- a) TKM and representative iwi organisations agreed that rohe information provided by iwi organisations should be added to the site without editing
- b) Each iwi organisation would provide TKM with a rohe map and/or a written description of their rohe
- c) Rohe maps would be copied into the TKM stylised format and added to the iwi rohe page
- d) The twelve regional maps were drawn with the express purpose of helping users of the site to navigate and each map, including Hauraki, has the following caveat beneath: "The areas depicted on this Map are indicative only for the purposes of navigating this website."
- e) The Disclaimer on TKM also includes the following:

Users should note that descriptions of rohe (tribal areas / areas over which iwi exercise kaitiakitanga for the purposes of the Resource Management Act 1991) and all Representative Organisation details are a record of information supplied by representative Māori organisations and have not been edited or changed by Te Puni Kōkiri in any way. Therefore their presence on this site does not imply endorsement or any statement about the accuracy of that information by Te Puni Kōkiri or the Crown.

Some information has been withheld in accordance with the Act on the following grounds:

- *Section 9(2)(a) to protect the privacy of natural persons*
- *Section 9(2)(i) to enable any department or organisation holding the information to carry out, without prejudice or disadvantage, commercial activities.*

I have considered the public interest considerations in section 9(1) of the Act.


I trust that my response satisfies your request.
